3. ENTRY FEES & CONDITIONS

Northern Nats 10 Entrant Tickets are available for purchase from 26 March 2026 until the commencement of the Event, unless sold out prior. Tickets are released in stages, with each release remaining available until its allocation is exhausted. All prices listed are exclusive of booking and handling fees, which are applied at the time of purchase.

The Event Organisers may refuse any entrant, at any time, at their discretion.

The entrant pricing is subject to change, at the discretion of the Event Organiser.

All entrants must hold a current un-suspended driver's license, with the exception of junior dragster racers;

- Provisional license holders are permitted.
- Learner drivers are permitted in the junior dragster category only.

The driver of the entrant vehicle **MUST** be the registered entrant for that vehicle; subsequent drivers are not permitted.

Entrants under the age of 18 years will require a parent or legal guardian to sign the RACERS Accreditation Event Waiver.

Refer to Appendix B for the full entrant terms and conditions.



4. RACERS ACCREDITATION

Northern Nats 10 is sanctioned by Recreation And Competitive Event Resources & Services Pty Ltd (hereinafter “RACERS”) ACN 098 088 610.

All competition entrants must hold a RACERS Clubman Licence - either an Event Licence or Annual Licence.

Licences can be purchased at scrutineering, if you do not have one.

All entrants are encouraged to create a RACERS account prior to arriving to the event.

5. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Consumption of alcohol in the pits, unlicensed areas or any section of the competition area under the control of the Event Organiser is forbidden.

All Entrants and Passengers may be tested, at random, for the presence of alcohol by an Official before competing. Any driver/crew returning a positive reading will be excluded from the event.

- **Positive Reading** means a reading greater “0.010” as displayed on the breathalyser.
- **Negative Reading** means a reading that is less than or equal to “0.010” as displayed on the breathalyser.

Entrants may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty (ies) for a breach.

6. REMOTELY PILOTED AIRCRAFT (RPA)

An RPA (drone) can be used at the Event, provided the RPA is operated within the guidelines outlined below:

- The RPA, RPA operator, and usage is approved by the Event Organisers.
- The RPA operator or controller is certified by Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA).
- The operator carries their own Public Liability Insurance (PLI).

7. EVENT REGULATIONS

This Event is a multi-discipline event held under the guidance of RACERS Accreditation, the Event Terms & Conditions of Entry (**Appendix B**), and these Event Regulations.



This Event is also held in accordance with any further regulations or Bulletins which may be issued, in reference to RACERS Accreditation.

Other activities may be conducted at the event that may not be under the conditions and Permit of RACERS Accreditation and will be solely the responsibility of the promoter.

This event may be abandoned, postponed, or cancelled in accordance with RACERS Accreditation. This event shall only be abandoned or cancelled in the case of Force Majeure under a decision of the Event Director.

Any Protest or Appeal of any result or decision must be in accordance with these Event Regulations.

8. PASSENGER POLICY

Passengers are permitted for eligible driving events only and solely at the discretion of Event Officials.

**Passenger waivers incur a fee at time of registration*

All passengers are required to sign the Passenger Waiver and once the form has been signed and witnessed by an official, the passenger will be provided with a passenger wristband. This wristband must remain fitted for the duration of the Event, or for the duration of their participation as a passenger.

Passengers during cruise route (smooth cruise) activities are not required to complete the passenger waiver form, however can opt to complete one.

Passengers who are under the age of 18, require a parent or legal guardian to authorise the Passenger Waiver.

If no passenger wristband is fitted, officials will request the passenger to complete a Passenger Waiver prior to their participation. Regardless, if they have previously signed a form. No signature, no wristband, no participation.



The passenger wristband will be supplementary to any other event wristband.

Entrant/drivers are not required to complete the Passenger Waiver, as all entrants/drivers have signed a waiver form during the event registration process.

Passengers must wear the mandatory PPE, for the eligible driving event, as outlined within these Supplementary Regulations.

Passengers must not be under the influence of alcohol and/or illicit substances and may be tested at random. Any passenger who records a positive reading, refuses testing, or is deemed by Event Officials to be under the influence of alcohol will not be permitted to participate in any passenger activity. Refer to Section 5 – Alcohol Policy.

9. FUEL

1.4.Storage

Entrants participating in competitions are permitted to store fuel within their designated pit.

Fuel must be stored in approved portable containers, in well-ventilated areas out of direct sunlight.

1.5.Refuelling

Refuelling is permitted in the designated pit area. Entrants must have an extinguisher and spotter when refuelling.

The driver and any passenger must be out of the vehicle during any refuelling.

Smoking is prohibited in the refuelling areas.

Children are not permitted in the refuelling area.

10. SCRUTINEERING

Scrutineering is held in the designated scrutineering shed, during the below days and times.

All entrants participating in Northern Nats must ensure their vehicle complies with the Minimum Vehicle Standards prescribed by the Event Organiser and complete the applicable scrutineering requirements outlined below.

Driver and vehicle accreditation will not be issued until all applicable scrutineering requirements have been completed to the satisfaction of the Event Organiser.



Event Officials may inspect any vehicle at any time throughout the event and may refuse participation or remove a vehicle from the event if it is deemed unsafe or non-compliant.

Fire Extinguishers

A fire extinguisher is mandatory for all vehicles entering Northern Nats, regardless of participation type.

The fire extinguisher must:

- Have a minimum capacity of 900g;
- Comply with AS1841; and
- Be readily accessible at all times.

Competition vehicles must have the extinguisher securely mounted within the vehicle. Display vehicles and non-competition vehicles may either securely mount the extinguisher or store it in a secure location within the vehicle.

*Vehicles will not be issued with entrant stickers and applicable competition accreditation until all the requirements have been met.

Vehicle Inspections and Audits



Event Officials reserve the right to conduct vehicle inspections, compliance checks and random audits at any time throughout the event.

Any vehicle found to be unsafe, non-compliant, leaking fluids, or otherwise considered unsuitable for participation may be refused entry to a competition activity or directed to cease participation until the issue has been rectified.

Vehicles must remain in the same condition as presented for scrutineering and inspection. Any unauthorised modification or alteration made after inspection may result in the vehicle being re-inspected and/or excluded from participation.

Event Officials may require a vehicle to undergo re-inspection at any time during the event. Failure to comply with a direction from an Event Official may result in exclusion from the activity or event.

Driver and Passenger PPE

Driver and passenger Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be inspected at sign-on and/or prior to participation in competition activities.

It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure all required PPE is available, compliant and presented for inspection when requested by Event Officials.

11. COMPETITION VEHICLES & LICENCING

All Entrants and vehicles participating in driving activities must comply with the following:

- These Event Regulations;
- Scrutineering Requirements, based on participation – Section 10.
- The RACERS licensing requirements applicable to the activity being undertaken.

Required RACERS licences include:

- Clubman Single Event Licence (can be purchased at the event); or
- Clubman Annual Licence.

The following activities require a valid RACERS licence:

- Burnouts
- Powerskids
- Roll Racing
- Drag Racing
- Northern Nats Champion

Entrants are responsible for obtaining the appropriate RACERS Licence for the Event, including the cost of the associated licence. Refer to Section 4 for further information.

Entrants who have not purchased a RACERS Licence prior to the Event may do so onsite through the Event Organiser during the scrutineering process. Participation in any driving activity will not be permitted until the appropriate licence has been obtained and verified.

Entrants who already hold a current and valid RACERS Licence applicable to the Event are not required to purchase an additional licence.



Existing licence holders are encouraged to provide their licence number through The Shed prior to the Event. Licence details may also be submitted by contacting the Northern Nats team via info@northernrats.com.au.

For all driving activities, the driver must be the registered Entrant associated with the vehicle. Driver substitutions, co-drivers and subsequent drivers are not permitted unless expressly approved by the Event Organiser and outlined elsewhere within these Supplementary Regulations.

12.COMPETITION EVENTS

1.6.BURNOUTS

The burnout competitions will be conducted in accordance with these Event Regulations.

Passengers are permitted within competition vehicles – Refer to Section 8 – Passenger Policy, for conditions.

All drivers and their passengers must comply with the following:

- Use a seatbelt or harnesses
- Purchase the applicable competition fee to participate in burnouts
- Attend (or where applicable complete) the compulsory drivers briefing
- Not be under the influence of alcohol and/or illicit substance. Random Breath Testing will be conducted on drivers and passengers
- Follow direction from Event Organisers and Officials if in breach



VEHICLE SAFETY

The following applies, in addition to the vehicle entry guide / scrutineering requirements, for vehicles participating in all burnout activities including competition, exhibition and demonstrations:

- A tailshaft loop is not required but is recommended
- A scatter shield is not required but is recommended
- Non-functioning rear brakes are permitted during burnout competitions only
- Wheel weights are not permitted
- Steel rims only, alloy rims are not permitted
- Steel valve caps are not permitted
- No loose items are to be inside the vehicle or boot area
- Selfie sticks are not permitted
- Where a go pro or similar is used, it must be securely fixed with an appropriate mount
- Mechanical works (including wheel changes) cannot be undertaken in the staging area without Official's approval
- Vehicles must have a working battery isolation switch (external mount not required)
- Open top automobiles must be fitted, as a minimum, with a Safety Cage and approved by the Event Steward a time of scrutineering inspection.

The following will apply the Event:

The Driver and passenger must remain restrained in the automobile at all times whilst the automobile is in motion and until such time as the burnout has ceased or red flagged. Waving of arm/s (only) from the window of the automobile is permitted during the conduct of the burnout.

COMPETITION FORMAT

Each category will have three (3) burnouts per entrant:

- Development Category – 3 burnouts
- Open Category – 3 burnouts
- Pro Category – 3 burnouts

The highest combined score across all three burnouts will determine the winner in each category.

JUDGING

The Burnout Judges (Judges of Fact) are:

- Kevin Peisley – Chief Judge – Development, Open & Pro Category (onsite)
- Matt Abood – Judge – Development, Open & Pro Category (onsite)
- Leonie Pollard – Judge – Development, Open & Pro Category (onsite)

The judge's decision shall be applied as a 'Judge of Fact' and are considered final. No protest may be made regarding the decision of the judges.

DRIVER BRIEFING

All Burnout entrants must attend the daily driver briefing (where applicable) held at the deck, at the time communicated. Attendance is mandatory. This session will cover the operational procedures, safety expectations, and race conduct. Failure to attend will result in exclusion from participation.

AWARDS

Refer to the Entrant Participation Guide for Awards.

1.7.POWERSKIDS

The Powerskid Competition will be conducted in accordance with these Event Supplementary Regulations and [Springmount Raceway Drag Racing Rules & Regulations](#)

Passengers are permitted within competition vehicles – Refer to Section 8 – Passenger Policy, for conditions.

JUDGING

Powerskids will be judged on distance and volume of smoke.

1.8.DRAG RACING

Drag Racing will be conducted over the Springmount Raceway ¼ mile drag strip in accordance with the [Springmount Raceway Drag Racing Rules & Regulations](#) and these Event Regulations.

COMPETITION FORMAT

All classes will compete using a Dial Your Own, Pro Tree format comprising:

- Three (3) Qualifying Rounds
- Three (3) Chicago Shootout Rounds
- 1 Final Per Class

DRAG RACING CATEGORIES & REQUIREMENTS

All vehicles must pass scrutineering and comply with the applicable [Springmount Raceway technical and safety requirements](#).

For PPE Requirements, refer to the [Springmount Raceway technical and safety requirements](#).

- OUTLAWS – 8.49 seconds and quicker
- QUICK ET – 8.50 – 9.99
- FAST STREET – 10.00 – 12.99
- STREET – 13.00 second and slower



- DRAG BIKE – All run format, for all drag bikes
- YOUNG GUNS – Junior Dragsters – for all junior dragsters

CATEGORY FIELD REQUIREMENTS

A minimum field of six (6) competitors is required for a category to proceed and be eligible for prize money and awards.

Where there are more than 32 racers in a single racing class, the Event Organiser will split that class into two or more classes as required.

If the Outlaws category does not receive a minimum of six (6) entries, competitors may be transferred to the Quick ET category at the discretion of the Event Organiser.

Where any other category does not achieve the minimum field requirement, the Event Organiser may:

- Combine the category with another suitable category;
- Transfer competitors into the next most appropriate category; or
- Cancel the category entirely.

The determination of category amalgamation, transfer or cancellation rests solely with the Event Organiser.

PASSENGERS

Passengers are not permitted in Drag Racing activities unless specifically approved by the Event Organiser and permitted under the applicable category regulations.

Where passengers are permitted, they must comply with the same minimum PPE requirements applicable to the driver.

DRIVER BRIEFING

All Drag Racing competitors must attend the daily Driver Briefing held thirty (30) minutes prior to the commencement of Drag Racing activities at the Scrutineering Shed.

Attendance is mandatory. Failure to attend may result in exclusion from participation.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

Refer to the Event Program for the detailed competition schedule.

JUDGING & AWARDS

Refer to the Entrant Participation Guide for Judging Categories and Awards.

1.9.ROLL RACING

Roll Racing will be conducted in accordance with the [Springmount Raceway Roll Racing Rules & Regulations](#) and these Event Regulations.

For the Northern Nats Event, unregistered vehicles are permitted to participate in the Roll Racing Competition, providing they pass scrutineering requirements.

Passengers are permitted in entrant vehicles during Roll Racing. Refer to Section 8 – Passenger Policy for passenger eligibility requirements.

DRIVER AND PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

All drivers and their passengers must comply with the following:

- Comply with these Event Regulations and all directions issued by the Event Organiser
- Wear a seatbelt or approved harness at all times
- Not be under the influence of alcohol or illicit substances. Random Breath Testing may be conducted in accordance with Section 5 – Alcohol Policy
- Follow all directions issued by Event Officials
- Conduct themselves in a safe and responsible manner at all times.

- ** Fire suits must be supplied by the Entrant - they will not be provided or available for hire from Event Organisers.*

PROHIBITED CONDUCT

The following activities are strictly prohibited:

- Powerskids;
- Slingshot starts;



- Brake checking;
- Lane weaving;
- Deliberate blocking of another competitor; and
- Any driving behaviour deemed dangerous by Event Officials.

Any entrant found to be engaging in prohibited conduct may be excluded from Roll Racing and/or the Event.

COMPETITION FORMAT

Roll Racing is conducted as a side-by-side acceleration activity commencing from a controlled rolling start and concluding at the quarter-mile finish line.

Vehicles will be paired by Event Officials and called forward to the staging area.

The objective of Roll Racing is to provide fair, safe and controlled competition between vehicles of similar performance.

DRIVER BRIEFING

All Roll Racing competitors must attend the daily Driver Briefing held at the Scrutineering Shed prior to the commencement of activities.

Attendance is mandatory. The briefing will cover operational procedures, safety requirements and race conduct expectations.

Failure to attend the Driver Briefing may result in exclusion from participation.

GENERAL

- All PPE must be presented for inspection upon request by Event Officials or Scrutineers.
- Competitors are responsible for ensuring their safety equipment remains compliant and serviceable for the duration of the Event.
- Failure to comply with the requirements of this section may result in exclusion from participation until compliance has been achieved.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

Refer to the Event Program and Entrant Participation Guide for the detailed competition schedule.

13. NON-COMPETITION

1.10. SMOOTH CRUISE

Passengers are permitted in entrant vehicles during cruising – refer to Section 8 for the Passenger Policy.



DRIVER AND PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

All drivers and their passengers must comply with the following:

- Adhere to the road regulations and any direction issues by the Event Organiser or any other local authorities (i.e. Queensland Police)
- Adhere to the Smooth Cruise speed limit of 20km/h
- Use a seatbelt or harnesses (unless the vehicle was originally manufactured without them)
- Use an approved child restraint, if applicable
- No burnouts or powerskids
- Not be under the influence of alcohol and/or illicit substances. Random Breath Testing will be conducted on drivers and passengers
- Follow direction from Event Organisers and Officials if in breach

VEHICLE SAFETY

- Vehicles must have a bonnet
- Vehicles registered as hot rods with no bonnet must have guards on any exposed components
- Vehicles must have functioning brakes fitted;
 - Front and rear brakes are required to participate in the smooth cruise.
 - Brake systems must be appropriately sized for the vehicle's modifications (e.g. upgraded engines require upgraded brakes).

SMOOTH CRUISE SCHEDULE

Refer to the Entrant Participation Guide and the Event Program for the detailed schedule.

1.11. SUPERCUISE + SKID ROW

Passengers are permitted in entrant vehicles during Supercruise + Skid Row activities – refer to Section 8 for the Passenger policy.

The Supercruise + Skid Activity will be conducted in accordance with these Event Regulations.

DRIVER AND PASSENGER REQUIREMENTS

All drivers and their passengers must comply with the following:

- Use a seatbelt or harnesses and be seated at all times
- Wear at a minimum; shorts, a shirt and closed toe shoes.



- Not be under the influence of alcohol and/or illicit substances. Random Breath Testing will be conducted on drivers and passengers
- Follow direction from Event Organisers and Officials if in breach

VEHICLE SAFETY

- A tailshaft loop is not required but is recommended
- Vehicles must have a bonnet
- Vehicles registered as hot rods with no bonnet must have guards on any exposed components
- Non-functioning rear brakes are permitted during the Supercruise activity and general 'commuting travel' to and from the Supercruise area

RULES & REGULATIONS – SUPERCruise

- Drivers must adhere to the speed limit of 80km/h on the drag strip and 40km/h on the return road.
- Slow points driven in a responsible manner and vehicles are to stay in the allocated lane
- A powerskid is permitted at the start line, and no further skids or stopping is permitted on the drag strip – total distance of 350m from the drag start line
- Powerskid utilises both lanes of the drag strip, with vehicles alternating between lanes - only one vehicle is permitted on the drag strip at any one time, unless approved by Event Officials
- Powerskids are permitted within the skid row / snake pit on the return
- Officials will control the release of vehicles in each lane, as required
- No static burnouts permitted
- No loops/ hoops permitted
- No popped tyres are permitted

When participating in the Skid Row Activity, drivers and their vehicle must comply with the following;

1. Drive in a straight line
2. Move with constant forward motion
3. Travel for a maximum distance of 40m
4. Produce a modest amount of smoke (permitted but not mandatory)
5. Travel at a maximum speed limit of 20km/h
6. Travel for a maximum time of 20 seconds
7. Complete the activity with no tyre delamination
8. Must stop upon completion of activity and wait for approval to leave by officials

Flag Signals:



A green flag indicates commencement of the activity area. Drivers must only enter the Skid Row Activity area when a green flag is provided.

A red flag indicates an immediate stop of activity to the driver and the passenger.

If a red flag is enacted for a fire, the driver of the vehicle must follow directions from the officials before restarting the vehicle.

If directed by officials, the vehicle will be pushed or towed out of the activity zone.
